After a jaw-dropping sunset graced the beachfront ceremony, the 70 guests gathered in the indoor/outdoor reception area. "The table settings were romantic and timeless, and the entire space was transformed into what felt like Old World Mexico, with iron candelabras and heaps of candles in all different sizes," says Kazarian. Further incorporating the native influences, the pair worked with the resort's culinary master, Chef Bueno, to create a menu that included roasted fish, rib-eye medallions and grilled vegetables from the property's organic garden.
